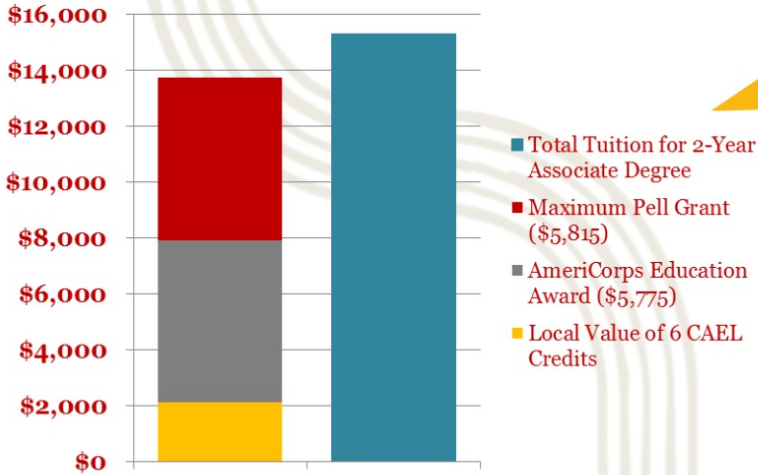

Chicago

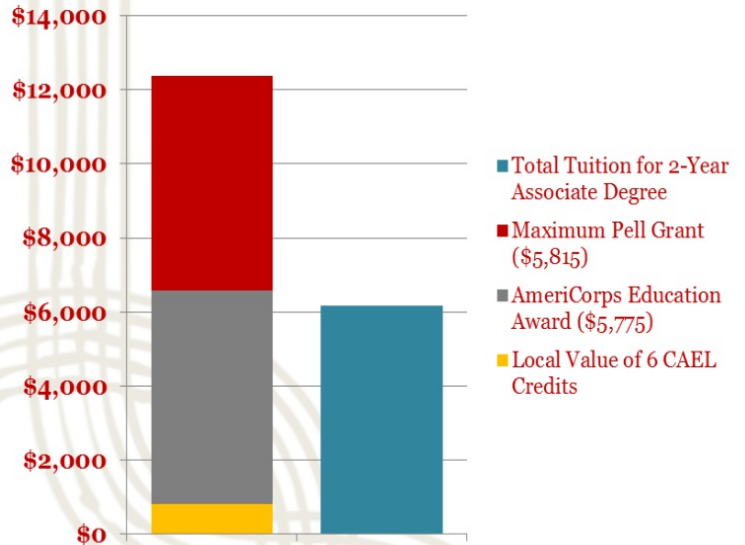


Public Allies graduates attending City Colleges of Chicago can complete a 2-year Associate Degree with minimal need for financial aid beyond a Pell grant.

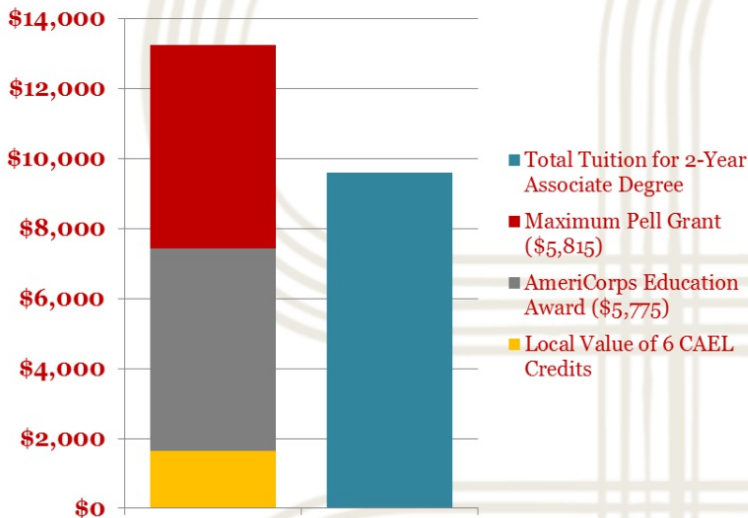


At CUNY and UDC Community College, graduates can complete an Associate Degree and still have resources to pursue a Bachelor's Degree.
